Call for Proposals: AATI-LI 3rd Annual Conference

Submission Guidelines

- Sessions/Roundtable discussion proposals should be made by 1 person. Co-presenters do NOT need to also submit a proposal.
- Session presentations will be 30-45 minutes in length; A presenter may have up to two co-presenters and should address a topic of interest to attendees in an engaging and interactive format that allows for audience participation within the session.
- Roundtable discussions: A roundtable presentation is a small group of teachers with typically a 30 minute presentation followed by 15 minutes of questions and discussion. Roundtables are an ideal format for networking and in-depth discussion on a particular topic. Presenters are encouraged to present and discuss their latest research or findings. This should allow for interaction between attendees with the goal of generating ideas that will benefit attendees and their students.
- Presenters whose proposals are selected for presentation MUST be available to present in person on Friday, March 4 at Hofstra University, but know that the format may change to virtual.
- Proposals will be chosen based on their relevance to the conference topic, innovation, and to the advancement of teaching and learning of the Italian language and culture.
- Selected presenters will be contacted by the end of January and asked to provide a final description of the presentation in Italian. Any materials that you plan to share with conference participants are expected to be provided approximately 1 week in advance of the Conference.
